It's called "From Reel to Deal" (Dov Simens), but even that wasn't detailed enough and it certainly didn't prep me for a real film shoot. This is truly the only filmmaking book you need. Everything is covered, including over 70 FULL COLOR HD PHOTOS so you can SEE what to do rather than READ what to do. All aspects of filmmaking are explained in detail; like how to write a great screenplay and format it in a text editor, how to direct like a pro, how to cast the best actors and get great performances, how to capture the right shots, how to choose the right equipment, how and when to light the set, how to properly record sound, how to create a slick edit, how to deal with adversity on the set, and much much more.
